Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize and delegate the Executive Director to:

- 1. Execute sub-recipient funding agreement, contract Z2228, and any amendments as designated authorized agent for the Northwest Florida Water Management District.
- 2. Sign project worksheets, request for reimbursements, and other documents for the Federal Emergency Management Agency/State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management (FEMA/FDEM) agreement.

Background

The District applied to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Public Assistance program for reimbursement of eligible expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Public Assistance funding is provided via a federal award agreement that recognizes the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) as the pass-through entity and the District as a sub-recipient of FDEM. Given this, the District and FDEM must enter into a sub-recipient funding agreement (designated Z2228) prior to the receipt of any federal funding. FDEM identifies the Board Chairman as the authorized agent to execute the public assistance funding agreement but allows for the delegation of this authority to a District employee.

A federal major disaster declaration for the COVID-19 pandemic was issued March 25, 2020 (DR-4486), with the incident period beginning January 20, 2020 (and continuing). Public Assistance funding is being made available at a 75-percent federal cost share for emergency protective measures to control, reduce, and eliminate threats to public health and safety.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to amend the Cooperating Technical Partner (CTP) agreement with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to accept and authorize spending \$1,398,000 in new funding to develop tools to assist communities reduce flood risk.

Discussion

Since 2004, the District has been a CTP with FEMA and received annual grant funding to improve and update flood hazard maps. This effort has been undertaken through FEMA's Map Modernization and Risk Mapping, Assessment, and Planning (Risk MAP) programs. Map Modernization is FEMA's program to update the nation's inventory of paper flood insurance rate maps and flood hazard data into a digital format. FEMA's Risk MAP program, started in Fiscal Year 2009, provides tools to help communities identify, assess, and reduce their flood risk. The tools and data developed are used to mitigate the risk and impact from flooding and communicate flood risk visually to residents and businesses.

The District has applied for grant funding for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 in the amount of \$1,398,000 to continue the Risk MAP work. This will include work to improve and update flood hazard maps in the Blackwater River Watershed. Funded activities also include Base Level Engineering (BLE) for the Lower Ochlockonee River watersheds, BLE pilot project, program management, and community outreach and mitigation strategies.

The District's match may include existing data and flood related services from the District, local, and state government sources. The final scope of work for this effort is detailed in

Mapping Activity Statement (MAS) 17, which will amend the District's CTP agreement with FEMA.

Background:

The Department of Environmental Protection submitted, and the Governor's Recommended Budget included, an issue for the Northwest Florida Water Management District's Hurricane Michael Recovery Effort. The legislature provided \$4,000,000 in the General Appropriation Act, LINE ITEM 1608 AID TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANTS AND AIDS – WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS HURRICANE RECOVERY. In order for the District to receive these funds, an agreement between the District and DEP will be needed. At this time, a draft agreement is not available for review. A standard funding agreement with the Department is anticipated.
