Recommendation:

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to execute a Joint Funding Agreement with the U.S. Geological Survey for continued monitoring at six streamflow monitoring stations and the Spring Creek Spring Group at a cost of \$99,423 for Fiscal Year 2022-23, subject to legal counsel review.

Discussion:

The District has participated in a cooperative water resource investigation program with the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) for the past 46 years. All five water management districts contract with the USGS for data collection services.

The program provides valuable water resource information and enables the District to maintain cooperating agency status with the USGS. This status provides the District access to USGS maps, records, reports, computer databases/applications, and training. This agreement provides funding for the USGS to operate and maintain stations on the Apalachicola River, Yellow River, Telogia Creek, Juniper Creek, Lost Creek, and at the Spring Creek Spring Group. Data collected includes continuous stage, discharge, and rainfall. At the Spring Creek Spring Group, stage, salinity and temperature are monitored. Data is updated in real-time and available on the USGS website. The data is used for resource monitoring, flood warning, and hydrologic evaluations.

The joint funding agreement includes \$99,423 in District funding and \$38,910 in USGS matching funds. Funding for this data collection work was included in the District's FY 2022-23 adopted budget.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board adopt Resolution No. 911 amending the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 budget and allow staff to realign revenues and reserves to maintain the proper balance in each fund.

Background

District procedures allow for budget amendments to occur within 60 days following the end of a fiscal year (FY). Based on expenditures paid that count toward the FY 2021-2022 budget, several changes are requested to properly align budget with these costs. Amendment No. 6 realigns budget categories of Salaries and Benefits (S&B), Contracted Services, and Operating Expenses within and across funds, programs, activities, projects, and categories. This amendment does not increase or decrease the total District budget.

Budget realignments include:

- 1. \$133,470 in budget transfers to Salaries and Benefits:
 - a. \$62,940 for Resource Management to accurately reflect staffing needs in the correct activities.
 - b. \$60,900 for District Administration and Management primarily for unanticipated leave payouts for previous staff (Executive Director and Director of the Division of Administration).
 - c. \$9,630 for Facilities and Public Information to provide sufficient budget for salary adjustments.
- 2. \$35,670 in transfers for Contracted Services and Operating Expenses:

- a. \$33,120 in operating expenses for fuel (\$28,800), repair and maintenance of recreation areas (\$3,020), and continuing education (\$1,300).
- b. \$2,550 in contracted services for legal services (\$1,900) and auditing services (\$650).

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board approve the bids submitted in response to ITB 22B-006 for 2023 Hand Planting Services for Reforestation and Groundcover Restoration and authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with the lowest bidder, Express Forestry Service, LLC., in the amount of \$96,012.63 to facilitate this work.

Background

On August 30, 2022, the District issued an Invitation to Bid (ITB) for services associated with ongoing reforestation and wetland mitigation programs on District lands. The 2023 services will entail hand planting 1,254,528 longleaf pine tubelings, 28,314 slash pine tubelings, and 75,000 groundcover plant tubelings in Bay, Calhoun, Jackson, Santa Rosa, Wakulla, and Washington counties in the Chipola River, Econfina Creek, and Yellow River Water Management Areas (WMAs) and on the E. Guy Revell Jr. Conservation Area (see attached General Location Maps). The services required of the contractor are outlined below.

Longleaf Pine Reforestation

The District will be planting 1,254,528 longleaf pine tubelings on 1,760.5 acres of disturbed natural longleaf pine habitat at a stocking rate of 726 tubelings per acre. This will occur in the Chipola River and Econfina Creek WMAs and E. Guy Revell Jr. Conservation Area.

Slash Pine Reforestation

The District will be planting 28,314 slash pine tubelings on 39 acres of disturbed natural slash pine habitat at a stocking rate of 726 tubelings per acre. This will occur on the Altha Tract within the Chipola River WMA.

Groundcover Restoration

The District will be planting 75,000 wiregrass plugs on 27.5 acres of upland sites that are undergoing restoration for mitigation purposes. These will be planted at stocking rates of 2,727 tubelings per acre. This groundcover restoration will occur on the Yellow River Ranch mitigation site in Santa Rosa County.



Enhancement Efforts on District lands

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with Arbor Day Foundation to receive a reimbursable grant in an amount up to \$269,396.82 to support district reforestation efforts; approve a grant donation of up to \$10,000 from The Nature Conservancy to support labor costs associated with reforestation efforts; and approve a grant donation from the National Wild Turkey Federation in an amount up to \$40,000.00 to support prescribed burning efforts to improve turkey habitat on the Choctawhatchee River Water Management Area.

Background

The Arbor Day Foundation provides grant funding for various types of tree-planting programs throughout the US, including resource restoration efforts at the Northwest Florida Water Management District.

In 2021, the District applied for and was awarded \$246,426.05 to plant 1,553,472 trees within the Econfina Creek and Chipola River WMAs. Subject to approval of this agreement from the Governing Board, this fiscal year's grant award will provide up to \$269,396.82 for the purchase and installation of 1,282,842 longleaf and slash pine tubelings which will provide significant assistance in restoring timber resources within these two WMAs that are recovering from severe impacts from Hurricane Michael.

As a member of the Apalachicola Regional Stewardship Alliance, the District regularly receives support and resources from The Nature Conservancy. Upon approval from the Governing Board, this will allow the District to receive a donation of up to \$10,000 for labor costs associated with tree planting.

The National Wild Turkey Federation provides grant funding assistance through the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission to support wildlife habitat conservation and enhancement projects throughout Florida. Upon approval from the Governing Board, this will

allow the District to receive a grant donation of up to \$40,000 for contract prescribed burning projects on 838 acres in the Choctawhatchee River WMA which will provide significant habitat improvement for the wild turkey.

Together, the above grant donation programs will provide a total of \$319,396.82 in support of the District's resource restoration program.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board approve the Fiscal Year 2022-23 update to the District Strategic Water Management Plan and authorize the Executive Director to finalize the plan pending any comments from the public and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

Discussion

Section 373.036, Florida Statutes (F.S.), provides the Governing Board the option of developing an annual strategic plan in lieu of a five-year District Water Management Plan. The strategic plan is intended to guide the District's strategic priorities for at least a five-year period and to identify supporting goals, strategies, success indicators, funding sources, deliverables, and milestones.

The District's Strategic Water Management Plan (SWMP) was most recently approved in September 2021. The proposed FY 2022-23 update identifies five strategic priorities that further the District's efforts consistent with the FY 2022-23 Adopted Budget:

- Water Quality Including continued progress on multiple spring protection and restoration projects, agricultural best management practices, and cooperative water quality improvement projects.
- Minimum Flows and Minimum Water Levels Data collection and modeling in support of technical assessments for two Outstanding Florida Springs, Jackson Blue Spring and the Gainer Spring Group; two second magnitude springs, the Sylvan Spring Group and the Williford Spring Group; and the Floridan aquifer in coastal Bay County.
- Water Supply Alternative water supply development, including continued progress on priority reuse projects in Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, and Bay counties; water supply development assistance for local cooperators; and water supply planning.

- Flood Protection and Floodplain Management Including the FEMA Risk MAP program and flood protection technical assistance to improve flood protection and enhance resilience for communities and natural systems.
- Watershed Protection and Restoration Including Hurricane Michael recovery and reforestation and continued development and implementation of projects in cooperation with local governments and stakeholders across northwest Florida.

Section 373.036, F.S., further requires, as an addendum, a separate Annual Work Plan Report on the Strategic Plan's implementation. The annual work plan report is submitted each year with the District's March 1 Consolidated Annual Report.

The 2022-23 SWMP will be made available for public review via the District's website. In addition to this opportunity to review and comment on the plan and participation in Governing Board meetings, the public is also afforded the opportunity to participate in the development of other plans and documents, which are functional components of the SWMP. Examples include regional water supply plans, the Florida Forever Work Plan, MFL technical assessments, and District rules.

The SWMP is not a self-executing plan; specific actions and expenditures are developed for separate consideration and approval. This plan is reviewed and updated annually based on performance measures and results outlined in the annual report, direction from the Governing Board, and input from the public and DEP.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Grant Funding for Construction of the Santa Rosa County Regional

Reuse System - Phase IV

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Governing Board authorize the Executive Director to enter into agreements with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and Santa Rosa County to receive and provide \$2.5 million in grant funding to support Phase IV of the South Santa Rosa Reuse Initiative, subject to budget authority and legal counsel review.

Background

In 2020, Santa Rosa County, the Holley-Navarre Water System, and the City of Gulf Breeze entered into a Memorandum of Agreement to support planning, engineering, and construction of a major multijurisdictional reclaimed water project for southern Santa Rosa County. The project includes engineering and construction of rapid infiltration basins, wastewater treatment upgrades, and reclaimed water transmission mains. This four-phase project has an overall cost estimate of \$32.8 million, and is expected to provide up to 1.4 million gallons per day of public access reclaimed water within the project area. The project will also achieve removal of effluent discharge into Santa Rosa Sound from the County's Navarre Beach Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). In addition to state alternative water supply funding, funding sources include local governments and utilities and RESTORE.

Phase IV is the final phase of this multi-phase project. It includes upgrades to the Navarre Beach WWTP for public access reuse and a 0.9 MG reject storage tank. This phase will support future connections and septic tank elimination in addition to the supplemental 0.9 MGD of reclaimed water for public access reuse. In September, the Department of Environmental Protection notified the District that Phase IV has been selected for funding with state alternative water supply funding. Previous phases have been funded by state AWS funding, the Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust Fund, and local cooperator funding.

By improving water quality in Santa Rosa Sound and expanding water reclamation and beneficial reuse within southern Santa Rosa County, this project advances implementation of two approved District plans: The Pensacola Bay System Surface Water Improvement and Management Plan and the Region II Regional Water Supply Plan.

SUBJECT: Informational Item - Rulemaking Update – 40A-1.2026 – Ingress and

Egress Easements Across District lands

The District is currently undergoing rulemaking to update Chapter 40A-1, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), General and Procedural Rules. This rule development will cover creating a rule within Chapter 40A-1, F.A.C., that establishes the criteria under which an ingress and egress easement may be granted across District-owned land.

The District published its Notice of Rule Development for this rulemaking in the Florida Administrative Register on November 1, 2022, and also in local newspapers throughout the District. The District anticipates holding a public rulemaking workshop in the coming months, which will be properly noticed and followed by an appropriate public comment period.

Staff continues to work on the draft rule language, with input from legal counsel and other technical staff, and expects the language to be in final draft form and ready for Board review and approval no later than the March 2023, Governing Board meeting.

Once the Governing Board reviews and approves the final draft language, staff will publish the Notice of Proposed Rule and proceed through the additional rulemaking steps outlined in Florida law. The District anticipates the rule should be effective by June, 2023.

Northwest Florida Water Management District, Petitioner, vs. GHD Construction Services, Inc., Defendant, Walton County Circuit Court Case No. 21CA137

The District continues to litigate its Petition for Enforcement against GHD Construction Services, Inc. ("GHD"), stemming from GHD's violation of a Consent Order and of District statutes and rules. The District is seeking an injunction against GHD to require its compliance with the Consent Order and to cease violating statutes and rules. The District is also seeking the statutory monetary penalties associated with such violations.

GHD is the holder of an environmental resource permit known as a "10/2 Self-Certification" for the development and construction of residential units in DeFuniak Springs. In February 2020, the District determined that GHD was not complying with its permit and was violating District statutes and rules by adversely impacting wetlands. The District and GHD entered into a Consent Order in February 2020, whereby GHD agreed to pay a penalty and remediate the impacted wetlands. GHD eventually paid the penalty, but it never began the required remediation. After many failed attempts to motivate GHD to perform the required remediation, the District was forced to file the Petition for Enforcement in April 2021; discovery and motion practice ensued.

The District has filed a motion for partial summary judgment, seeking judgment by the Court that GHD is in violation of the Consent Order and imposing statutory monetary penalties and an injunction mandating GHD's immediate compliance with the Consent Order.

A hearing on the motion for partial summary judgment has been set by the Court for December 6, 2022, at 10:30AM CST.

Trial has been set for one day on March 8, 2023, at 9:00AM CST.
